



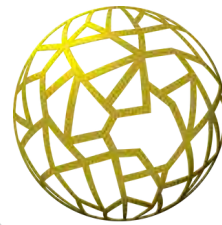

Pawa Liklik NGO Forum is targeted at strengthening the role and resilience of small to medium sized Australian Non-Government Organisations (NGOs) working in overseas aid and international development.

Small to medium sized NGOs face a suite of unique challenges that are related to their size. However, they also demonstrate a range of qualities and approaches to development that make them efficient, nimble and adept in creating meaningful impact and delivering outcomes in collaboration with people and communities.

The purpose of Pawa Liklik NGO Forum is to provide a platform for small to medium sized NGOs working in international development to share knowledge and expertise, ideas, plans and policies, and monitoring and evaluation outcomes with the sector.

Hosted by KTF, an Australian medium-sized NGO working in Papua New Guinea (PNG), the Pawa Liklik NGO Forum is the first of its kind in Australia.

Highlights include:
