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## OVERVIEW

Kokoda Track Foundation (KTF) is an international aid organisation working in Papua New Guinea. KTF supports communities in PNG overcome some of the tremendous challenges they face today. From a lack of adequate health care, to the half a million children who are unable to attend school because of the lack of teachers, resources, infrastructure and government capacity, KTF aims to make a tangible impact in the lives of the most vulnerable. In 2026, KTF is celebrating 23 years of life-changing impact in PNG.

We run programs in the vital areas of education, health, equality and leadership across remote and rural communities right across Papua New Guinea. Education is the key to PNG's future. Investing in a strong, confident and empowered generation of teachers, quality school infrastructure and high quality learning environments for children in remote and rural PNG is the focus of our work in education. KTF believes that everyone has a right to inclusive, equitable and quality education. In health, KTF is supporting up to 17 health facilities across the Oro and Central provinces by investing in CHWs and supplying a quarterly supply of drugs, medical resources and water, sanitation and hygiene solutions. KTF operates Kicks 4 Kokoda in partnership with the PNG Olympic Committee. K4K uses the power of sport to inspire and educate young women and men to pursue health seeking behaviour and challenge existing harmful norms. KTF is also working with expert partners to design and deliver innovative specialist training in eye health and child and maternal healthcare, literally saving lives. KTF is addressing family sexual violence and domestic violence via its Project Zero initiative in Oro Province – supporting awareness, facilitating referral pathways and operating a safe haus – all a first of its kind in Oro Province.

In 2026, KTF is continuing its ***Archer Leadership Program*** – an opportunity for students studying across **all tertiary institutions** in Papua New Guinea. The Archer Leadership Program is a year-long leadership development opportunity for exceptional PNG tertiary students who have ***demonstrated leadership potential***. The program offers successful recipients a year-long suite of activities and programs aimed at developing their leadership skills and abilities. The premise behind the program is that intensive leadership support and resource investment during a student's final year of tertiary studies will provide the recipient with a new platform to engage in leadership work and activities after they graduate.

The leadership program will identify, foster, and invest in an annual cohort of promising leaders and will provide a range of opportunities and resources to grow their leadership skills.

## PROGRAM OUTLINE

The year-long Archer Leadership Program consists of the following activities and opportunities:

- Education investment – the program covers a **contribution** towards the students' tertiary fees for the final year of their studies at University or College in PNG<sup>1</sup>.
- Living allowance – the program provides a **contribution** towards the students' boarding and food costs for the final year of their studies at University or College in PNG.
- Resource investment – each student receives an allowance to purchase educational and other relevant resources for their tertiary studies and leadership development. Resources may include laptop computers, mobile phones, wireless internet connections, textbooks, reading books, professional attire and materials to assist specific study areas.
- Leadership courses – the cohort of students will participate in a number of leadership workshops throughout the year in Port Moresby and Australia.
- Leadership exchange – two week leadership exchange program to Australia where participants will meet inspiring leaders from all walks of life, be exposed to community development organisations tackling challenging social issues and have the opportunity to harness personal leadership skills.
- Mentoring – each student will be matched with a mentor in PNG, Australia or beyond who will support them with guidance and coaching during their year-long leadership program. This one-on-one support is vital to students' learning throughout the year and has been shown to have an enormous and transformative impact on students' self-esteem, motivation, future goals, and leadership development.
- Community Project - students will also undertake a community development project during the course of the year and will be supported financially and with mentoring and project supervision to undertake this project.

## ELIGIBILITY (please read carefully)

- Applicants must be in their final year of tertiary education at a University or College in PNG in 2026;
- Applicants must be PNG citizens and of PNG heritage;
- Applicants must be aged between 18 and 35 years of age;
- Applicants must be willing and able to participate in all components of the Archer Leadership Program including all leadership workshops and the international exchange trip. Please note that some workshops and program elements will occur over some weekends throughout 2026.  
**If you cannot commit to these weekends then you are not eligible to apply;**
- Applicants must be willing to abide by all of the Kokoda Track Foundation's policies (during all program activities) including its strict *No Alcohol Drugs & Betel Nut Policy, Child Protection Policy & Child Protection Code of Conduct, Prevention of Sexual Exploitation, Abuse and Harassment Policy and KTF's Code of Conduct.*

## SELECTION CRITERIA

The *Archer Leadership Program* is a **PNG-wide** program and KTF is now calling for nominations from all tertiary institutions across the country. Students will be asked to submit a detailed application (see attached form) to KTF. 20-25 applicants will be shortlisted and will undergo an extensive interview with an expert panel. Students will be selected on the basis of strict selection criteria including:

- Gender equality
- Academic merit and effort
- Demonstrated leadership experience and potential
- Commitment to community
- Quality of application
- Socioeconomic background and need

### **Applicants must address the following criteria in their application to KTF:**

***Academic Excellence*** – applicants must have and demonstrate evidence of outstanding academic achievement in their tertiary (and prior) studies in PNG. Evidence will include academic University/College course transcripts, HSC results, and other awards and achievements. Students must also demonstrate strong academic effort and commitment to their studies and must support this with examples of both academic performance and extra-curricular academic activities.

***Leadership Potential*** – applicants must demonstrate leadership potential and prior experience. Applicants should be recognised by their community, peers, and fellow leaders as having leadership potential and must demonstrate this via references and relevant appointments (such as election to the Student Representative Council, Leadership roles within university or college & high school, leadership roles in sporting teams and similar achievements). Please consider both informal and formal leadership roles held and tell us everything.

***Commitment to Community*** – applicants must demonstrate a strong commitment to their community and the broader PNG society. Applications must demonstrate a commitment to helping others and participating in community work and other voluntary projects (within their university context, home context, village context or more broadly).

***Disability inclusive*** - people with a disability are encouraged to apply for the *Archer Leadership Program* and will be supported to participate in the year-long program.

***Gender equality*** – KTF is committed to gender equality in all aspects of its operations and programs, including the *Archer Leadership Program*. KTF strives to shortlist and select an equal number of women and men.

## KEY DATES

Monday 22 December 2025 – Applications open

Monday 9 February 2026 – **Applications close at midnight (no extensions to deadline).**

Thursday 19 February 2026 – Shortlisted candidates contacted and invited to interview.

Wednesday 25 February & Thursday 26 February 2026 – Interviews in Port Moresby (or virtually via video link) for shortlisted candidates.

Thursday February 26 – 2026 Archer Leadership Award Winners announced as a cocktail event.

Friday February 27 and Saturday February 28 2026 – 1<sup>st</sup> **Leadership Workshop** in Port Moresby.

March 2026 – **Mentoring Program Begins:** Recipients matched with mentors and begin coaching

March 2026 – **Tuition Fees and Boarding Support:** Tuition fees and boarding costs will be reimbursed to the Archer Leaders. Evidence of enrolment, tuition invoices and evidence of payment of fees will be required.

Mid-Late June 2026 – **Australian Exchange Trip:** Two week leadership exchange trip to Australia.

February / March 2027 – Awards Ceremony: Recipients graduate as the *2026 Fred P. Archer Leaders* at a ceremony in Port Moresby attended by KTF and prominent guests.

*NB. The above dates are estimates and are subject to change. Please also note that some activities fall on a weekend. **Applicants must be willing to participate in program related activities that fall on weekends.***
